Drummer/percussionist Simone Sou (1970, BR) started as a musician in the early 1990s in São Paulo playing with bands and artists who were part of the MPB (Brazilian Popular Music) scene. Researching traditional rhythms with master Robertinho Silva, Sou mixes afro/indigenous/world music to her urban contemporary style creating her 'Percuteria Setup'. With artists such as Badi Assad, Os Mutantes, Chico César, Bixiga 70 and Oleg Fateev, Sou performed in festivals around the world. She has released her music on CDs, including SimOneSou and S.O.S. Bras Beat.

Drummer, percussionist and band-leader Lucas van Merwijk (1961, NL) has been at the forefront of the European jazz, Latin and percussion scene for over 30 years. He was elected Best Jazz Drummer and Best Fusion Drummer in the Benelux countries by readers of De Slagwerkkrant many times between the years 1993 and 2020. He is the founder and musical director of the Cubop City Big Band, which plays Latin jazz with a twist. He teaches Drums at the Conservatorium van Amsterdam.

Dominique Vleeshouwers (1992, NL) is a solo percussionist known professionally as DOMNIQ. He was the first percussionist to win the prestigious Dutch Music Prize in 2020, and the winner of the first prize, as well as the press and the audience awards at the international TROMP Percussion Competition in Eindhoven, 2014. He is known for his virtuosic percussion skills and out–of–the–box projects. He has done solo concerts in the Netherlands, Belgium, Germany, Russia, Brazil, China, Japan and Mexico.
